

Letter from the Belgium Front to his parents and
sisters at Roe Greave Road, Oswaldtwistle, Lancashire.

Date: 01 May 1917



11/5/17
My Dear Parents & Sisters

Many thanks indeed for your welcome
letter of the 18th. I am sorry that you
have had the burglars, and that mother's
watch has been stolen. I would like to
have just caught them in the act, they
would not have got away so easily.
I hope that you will soon get it back
again. Our Jack seems to be having a trip
round the world, and I expect that he
will have 'seen the sights'. Well we
are still putting old Fritz and am hoping
that we will have pushed him out
of existence before long. I have nothing
much in the way of news. Hope that you
are all keeping in the best of
health. I am keeping alright just now.

WW1— A LETTER FROM THE FRONT - 01 May 1917


